In 2026, Virginia Arts Festival proudly welcomes the return of Dance Theatre of Harlem — this time bringing one of the company's most beloved signature works: *Firebird*. This legendary production reimagines the classic Russian folk tale of love's triumph over evil in a lush, Caribbean setting. With John Taras' masterful choreography, Igor Stravinsky's iconic score (1945 version) performed live by the Virginia Symphony Orchestra, and Geoffrey Holder's dazzling costumes and sets, *Firebird* is a feast for the senses. First created in 1982, this Dance Theatre of Harlem classic has toured the world and enchanted audiences everywhere. As *The New York Times* declared: "...it does one thing other versions do not — send its audience into a whooping spell of delirium."

DANCE THEATRE OF HARLEM

Virginia Arts Festival welcomes back one of America's most celebrated dance companies, Dance Theatre of Harlem, to Ferguson Center for the Arts in Newport News. Under the direction of Artistic Director Robert Garland, the company's extraordinary dancers bring to life an exhilarating program that showcases works from some of today's most acclaimed choreographers, merging the grace of classical ballet with the vitality of contemporary dance.

From lush and sweeping ensemble movement to breathtaking pirouettes, jumps and lifts, Dance Theatre of Harlem delivers a performance that thrills.

This program will feature *New Bach*, a neoclassical ballet created by Dance Theatre of Harlem Artistic Director Robert Garland and first performed in September 2001, immediately after 9/11; *Passage of Being*, which premiered this year, is a circular and physical piece unfolding in three cinematic movements set to the evocative music of Oscar®-nominated composer Ryan Lott *Everything Everywhere All at Once*; and *Return*, a soulful, high-octane celebration of the timeless sounds of James Brown and Aretha Franklin.




A SOLO EVENING OF MUSIC WITH CHRIS THILE





Alisa Weilerstein's *FRAGMENTS 5* marks the next chapter of her groundbreaking, multi-year solo cello project, which interweaves movements from J.S. Bach's Cello Suites with 27 newly commissioned works by leading contemporary composers. Each installment is crafted as an immersive, theatrically staged experience, performed without interruption.

FRAGMENTS 5 features new works by composers including Gabriela Lena Frank, Gabriella Smith, Gerard McBurney, Mathilde Wantenaar, and Osvaldo Golijov, thoughtfully paired with J. S. Bach's Cello Suite No. 5. The result is a singular, multisensory journey that invites listeners to experience the cello repertoire in a completely new way.

Presented in the intimate Concert Hall at The College of William & Mary as part of the Virginia Arts Festival's 2026 season and co-presented with the College of William & Mary, this special 60-minute performance offers audiences a rare opportunity to experience Weilerstein's visionary project just before she performs it at Carnegie Hall.
